

Civil War Battlefield Driving Tour Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania, VA

Fredericksburg, Virginia is located on the Rappahannock River in Virginia, south of Washington, D.C. The area is known for its colonial and Civil War history, and the 4 battlefields of the Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Military Park. This driving tour passes through the Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, Wilderness and Spotsylvania Court House battlefields. The park's Fredericksburg National Cemetery is the final resting place of thousands of Union soldiers. This driving tour starts and finishes at the Fredericksburg Expo & Conference Center at Celebrate Virginia. Street Address is 2371 Carl D. Silver Parkway, Fredericksburg, Virginia 22401.









Fredericksburg, Virginia tells America's story – from 1608 when Captain John Smith sailed up the Rappahannock River to George Washington's childhood and adolescence to John DeBaptiste, a free Black man fighting in the Revolutionary War to the Civil War with four major battles and where 10,000 enslaved people crossed the river to freedom, to Reconstruction and the fight for Civil Rights and social justice. The region is filled with historic sites and compelling stories, a phenomenal food and drink scene and is all easily accessible just off the interstate.

Fredericksburg, Virginia is located fifty miles south of Wa<mark>shi</mark>ngton, D.C. on Interstate 95, midway between Washington, D.C. and Richmond, Virginia.
